I am an Associate Senior Lecturer at the Department of Economic History in Lund University and a research affiliate at *Instituto Figuerola - Universidad Carlos III de Madrid*. I am a trained economist with a marked multidisciplinary profile at the edge of economic history and economic geography. My thesis analyzed the patterns of service employment concentration during the 20th century in the United States and outlined the determinants for those patterns. My broader research interests are related to the effects of place-based policies in the evolution of regional inequality over time and space, combining historical data and modern techniques such as Geographic Information Systems software and spatial econometrics. I am currently analyzing spatial trends of several aspects of society (namely economic activity, population, and gender inequality) and their persistence over time in the US, several European countries, and Africa.
